Dr. Thomas Lacher, Jr. is Professor and Department Head in the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries Sciences. He received his PhD in Biological Sciences from the University of Pittsburgh in 1980 and has held positions at the University of Brasilia, Brazil; Western Washington University; Clemson University, where he was the director of the research consortium of the Archbold Tropical Research Center; and held the Caesar Kleberg Chair in Wildlife Ecology during a previous appointment at Texas A&M. He also was Senior Vice President in charge of research at Conservation International. His research has focused on the ecology and behavior of mammals, the applications of GIS technology to wildlife conservation, the effects of environmental contaminants on wildlife populations, and the development of a network of field stations that implement standardized protocols for monitoring biodiversity. He has 30 years of international experiences, primarily in the Caribbean, Mexico, Central and South America.
